Curriculum Content Objectives

To receive credit, students will perform 100% of the following content objectives:

1. Conduct client consultations
2. Perform salon services
3. Plan work schedule according to scheduled appointments and walk-in clientele
4. Track services and service-to-client ratios
5. Practice safety and sanitation procedures following Minnesota State guidelines
6. Demonstrate professionalism

Assessments

Students must achieve no less than 80% or B for a final grade in the high school course to receive ACC.

1. The student must be a senior to receive the Articulation Certificate.
2. The student must enroll at the higher education institution within one year of high school graduation (Example: May 2025-Aug 2026).
3. Students will earn college credit for high school instruction credit: 32 hours of high school instruction credit will convert to 1 college lab credit. Timesheets will validate hours and will vary for students.
4. Quotas for license areas will also be transferred in.

ACC Concept

Through Articulated College Credit (ACC), specific college curriculum content goals and assessments are embedded in participating high school career and technical education (CTE) programs as specified in this agreement. Relevant knowledge, skills, and standards are taught by qualified CTE high school instructor(s) in one or more high school courses. ACC is awarded if the student meets the college equivalency standards and later enrolls in the college(s) listed requiring the course in a specific program.
