4. Identify and operate hand power tools
  - belt sander
  - finish sander
  - pneumatic tool
  - portable power saw
  - power drill
  - power planes
  - reciprocating saw
  - rotary hammer
  - router
5. Identify and operate stationary power tools
  - band saw
  - drill press
  - jointer
  - power miter saw/box
  - table saw
6. Safely construct a project
