Course Description

This course includes First Aid and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) for the Adult, Child, and Infant. The curriculum follows the National Safety Council, American Heart Association, American Red Cross guidelines, and National Standards. Participants learn techniques and participate in skills that will prepare them for life-threatening emergencies as well as basic first-aid situations.

Curriculum Learning Outcomes

100% of the curriculum learning outcomes will be covered in the high school course(s) by qualified CTE high school instructor(s).

To complete these requirements, students will administer First Aid and CPR in accordance with the American Red Cross or American Heart Association

1. Discuss emergency action principles.
2. Check a conscious and unconscious victim.
3. Discuss breathing emergencies.
4. Demonstrate rescue breathing.
5. Demonstrate helping a choking victim, with obstructed airway management.
6. Recognize the signs and symptoms of a heart attack.
7. Perform adult CPR.
8. Discuss infant/child life-threatening emergencies.
9. Perform child CPR.
10. Demonstrate rescue breathing and CPR for the infant.
11. Demonstrate mouth to mask ventilation.
12. Understand the use of AED (automated external defibrillator).
13. Identify leading causes of injury.
14. Control external bleeding.
15. Identify signs & symptoms of bone, muscle, and joint injuries.
16. Immobilize bone injury.
17. Understand the signs & symptoms of sudden illnesses.
18. Discuss unique needs in caring for children and the elderly.
