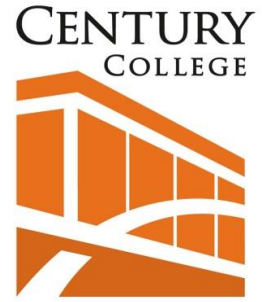

CRITERIA FOR TECHNICAL PREPARATION COLLEGE CREDIT:

1. Completion of the college course requirements as a junior or senior in high school;
2. A minimum of a grade of A or B must be achieved;
3. Graduation from high school in good standing;
4. Enrollment at Century College within three years of the date of the Certificate of Credit with follow-up on post high school placement allowed; and
5. **Presentation of an ACC report and an official high school transcript that shows graduation - to the Century College Transfer Student Services Office.**

WHAT IS ARTICULATION AND ARTICULATED COLLEGE CREDIT

Articulation

Articulated high school courses require attainment of skills and content covered in parallel college courses. In order to eliminate the duplication of learning, an articulation agreement is completed between the high school and college. High school and college articulated credits can be earned simultaneously if the student achieves a grade of A or B and completes the enrollment process at Century College.

Enrollment Process

- Student must complete the Student Agreement for Articulation form (agreement between Northeast Metro Perkins IV Consortium, Century College and the participating high school) and submit the form to the high school instructor;
- Student must create an account and “enroll” in the articulated high school course online at ctecreditmn.com
- Student must earn a grade of A or B;
- At the end of the course the high school instructor must enter the student grade on the website under each agreement;
- Student will receive an e-mail and directions on how to print out an ACC report from the ctecreditmn.com website
- For enrollment at Century College, the student must apply to Century College online or submit an Application form to the Century Admissions office; and
- **Submit the ACC report within three years of course completion and an official high school transcript that shows graduation in good standing to the Century Transfer Student Services Office.**
- Articulated College Credit is entered as transfer credit on the college transcript after the 10th day of enrollment.

Articulation Credit(s) for Century College

Transfer credit will be awarded for the Articulated course(s) and the credit will appear on a Century College transcript. A transcript will not be developed for a student who has completed an Articulated course(s) and does **not** enroll at Century College.

Articulation Credit(s) for Other Colleges

Other colleges, who do not have signed agreements with Northeast Metro Perkins IV Consortium, may or may not accept Articulated College Credits in a similar program. To assist in the possible attainment of this credit, it is recommended that students provide the Certificate of Credit, the course syllabus (provided by the high school teacher), an official high school transcript, and a copy of the Articulation Agreement (provided by the high school teacher) to the college major advisor at the time of enrollment. Century College is not responsible for the acceptance of Technical Preparation College Credit(s) by other colleges or institutions.
